Zora Neale Hurston (1891 – 1960), the author of the ten plays . . . deposited these scripts with the United States Copyright Office . . . to place copies in trust with the government. . . . Included in the group . . . are four very short plays (sketches or skits) and six full-length plays. Most are light-hearted if not outright comedies and several include song lyrics without the associated music. Hurston knew the songs and the subjects of these plays from her own upbringing and her professional folklore research in the African-American South. She identified as her hometown Eatonville, Florida, the first African-American incorporated township. During the 1920s, 1930s, and 1940s, Hurston traveled the American South collecting and recording the sounds and songs of her people.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that from and after the expiration of ninety days next after the passage of this act, the coming of Chinese laborers to the United States be . . . suspended.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives. . . All charges made for any service rendered or to be rendered in the transportation of passengers or property . . . or for the receiving, delivering, storage, or handling of such property, shall be reasonable and just; and every unjust and unreasonable charge for such service is prohibited and declared to be unlawful.

An act for preventing the manufacture, sale, or transportation of adulterated or misbranded or poisonous or deleterious foods, drugs, medicines, and liquors, and for regulating traffic therein, and for other purposes.



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



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


